How to load your own tunes to the **Simple Music Player***

If you are experienced at transferring files between computers and personal devices, you can load your own tunes to your Simple Music Player (SMP).

Tunes are loaded to the SMP by means of a USB cable connection to your computer. There is no software to install. The SMP is compatible with all systems which support USB; Apple, Microsoft, Linux, etc.

The following file formats are compatible with the SMP: MP3; .m4a; .wma; .aac; .wav

Once recognised by your computer, the SMP acts as a standard USB drive. Simply copy your music files from the computer to the SMP. Tunes can be individually uploaded or deleted at anytime using this method.

Please read carefully as the correct steps need to be followed.

1. Turn off the power to your SMP at the wall.
2. Insert the provided USB cable into the USB port at the back of the SMP.
3. Connect the other end of the USB cable to a USB port on your computer.
4. Now turn on the power to your SMP.
5. The SMP will appear as "SMPV100" in your list of drives.
6. Delete any files you do not require from "SMPV100" then drag or copy your files to the SPM in the usual manner. See note below.
7. Once the files are copied, turn the power to the SMP off at the wall, remove the USB cable and turn the SMP back on before playing your tunes.

Note: If you continue to hear files you believe you have deleted, it is recommended that you **format** the SMPV100 and repeat the procedure. Please take care to format the correct drive.
